The Lenten Cross

During the season of Lent, the Lenten Cross is in place at the front of Barbee's sanctuary. Each Sunday candles are lit, shining brightly, and each Sunday a candle is extinguished, then one by one each week the lights on the cross are gone. The dark candles will be replaced on Easter morning with white candles, representing that the "Light of the World", Jesus, has risen!

Ash Wednesday Service:

On Wednesday, March 6, congregants of Barbee Memorial participated in the Ash Wednesday Service. The quiet, focused service led by Pastor Dan brought the congregation through scriptures and readings and a short message. Nearly 35 joined in the service which ended with the placing of ashes on the forehead of each one that came forward.

The ashes for Ash Wednesday come from the burnt palms from last year's Passion Sunday celebration, which begins Holy Week. So, these ashes bring us back to our last celebration of the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Jesus for us. On this first day of Lent each year, we begin a journey of renewal - from death to life. This is a joyful season. We will make sacrifices, in order to try to let God reform our desiring, but this is a time for God to be generous to us.

Leak Found, Gas Turned Off:

Due to a leak in the gas line, the gas company turned off the gas at the church. Thankfully, Noah's Ark preschool was on spring break, allowing bids to be taken to repair the gas line. Congregants went without furnace heat, but were kept warm with coats, throws and small heaters on Sundays, March 17 & 24. The gas line was to be repaired the following week.

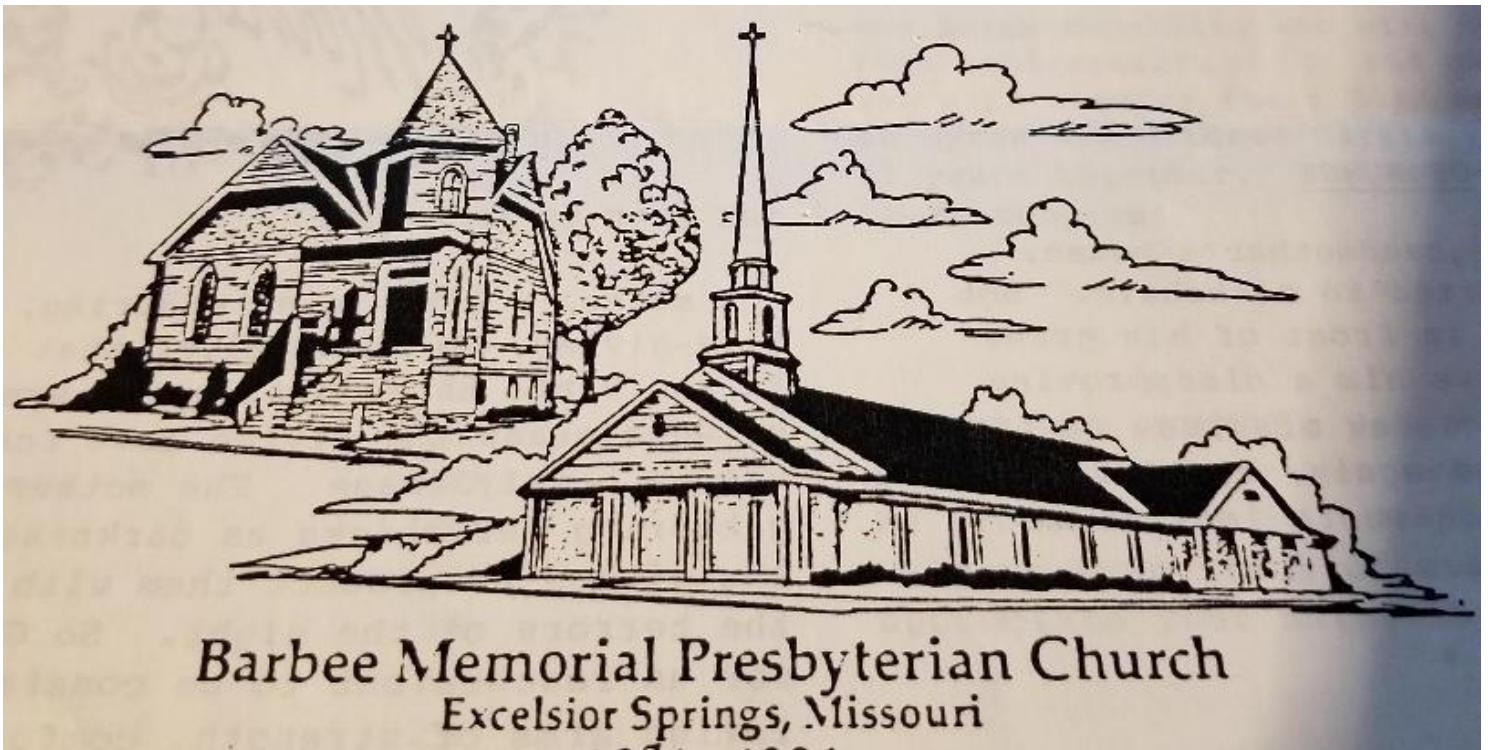
Quasquicentennial Celebration Date Set:

Ministry Team Updates:

HOSPITALITY: SHARE THIS SPIRITUAL GIFT - THE GIFT OF HOSPITALITY.

In the book, *We Want You Here*, author Thom Rainer discusses all aspects of hospitality. He explains within the Church we are all connected through Christ Jesus and it is through that connection where we find ourselves; called to share the Love of Christ and to spread the good news of the Gospel; thereby growing the church.

Rainer begins with explaining the basics; 5 reasons we want others to be guest at our church:

- 1) We want our guests to experience the Love of Christ.
- 2) We want to serve our guests.
- 3) We want our guests to make a difference.
- 4) We want to get to know our guests.
- 5) We like guests.

A smile, handshake, opening a door or directing a mom and dad with little ones to the nursery all these gestures are simple yet genuine acts of hospitality. Sound interesting?

The Hospitality Team is developing guidelines for a new ministry under the auspices of the team. We have long had Greeters at the door on Sunday mornings. Our Greeters are warm and friendly people who are quick to offer a smile, a handshake and in many cases a hug. We rely on them to hand out bulletins and to offer assistance to those entering the Church. Greeters are a necessary and important part of the hospitality team and yet they are NOT **Ambassadors**. We have never had **Ambassadors**.

Ambassadors will be those people who “man” the new station in the narthex before services start on Sundays. They will be “armed” with knowledge to share about Barbee including small groups, tenets of our faith, and ministry teams. They will also be prepared to welcome newcomers, provide informational brochures, tours of the church, and answer any questions guests may have.

This new ministry opens the opportunity for more of us to take an active role, to be in service.

Souper Bowl CHILI winner = Jim Vassmer's Chipotle Chili recipe

This recipe can be upsized or downsized and none of the ingredient measurements are precise. I don't really have a recipe for chili, I just experiment. The batch I made for the "Souper Bowl" is as follows:

3 pounds of lean ground beef, fry in a skillet until no longer pink, drain

Add to the meat $\frac{3}{4}$ cup (or 3 pkgs) of Williams chili seasoning and stir well

Place meat in large crock pot

Add:

3 cans of Rotel, your preference for heat

3 – 16 oz. cans of tomato sauce

1 small can of tomato paste (optional, adds a little sweetness and thickens the chili a little)

2-3 – 16 oz. cans of chili beans (or none, your preference)

2 – 16 oz. cans of white corn or use frozen shoe peg corn

$\frac{1}{4}$ cup of chipotle chilies in adobo sauce pureed (more or less to your taste). The chipotle adds some heat and a nice smoky flavor.

You should always look at chili recipe as a guideline, experiment, customize it to your taste, enjoy!

**MINUTES OF STATED MEETING OF SESSION
OF BARBEE MEMORIAL PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH
March 18, 2019**

The Session of Barbee Memorial held its Stated Meeting on March 18, 2019 at 6:30 p.m. in the Adult Classroom of the church. Elders present: Laura Mayfield, Clark Pugh, Bill Spencer, Jim Vassmer, Jerry Summers, Sharon Senger and Grace Harriger. A quorum was established. Also present: Dan Clark, Pastor and Moderator, Carol Nolting, Treasurer, and Clerk of Session, Cheryl Faulkner.

The meeting was called to order at 6:33.m. and opened with prayer by Pastor Dan Clark.

The Agenda was reviewed with the addition of items to New Business (Gas leak and MediaCom) plus Facility Use request (April 27 for Eagle Court of Honor); changes incorporated and accepted. The motion was made by Laura Mayfield and seconded by Jerry Summers to accept the agenda with additions: passed.

Consent Agenda Items:

Clerk's report – attendance was reported for small groups and church services. George Hiser passed away on Feb. 19, 2019.

Minutes of Regular Session meeting February 18, 2019 were approved by email vote by February 20, 2019.

Minutes of an emergency Called Session meeting on March 10, 2019 were approved by email vote by March 14, 2019.

Ministry team reports as summarized:

Finance ministry team: The meeting was held on March 4, 2019 at 7pm. Updates were reviewed for the counting process and procedures. Some clarification was needed for the 5th Sunday Brother's Keepers offering fund. The team plans to meet quarterly with the next meeting to be held April 23rd at the church.

Mission Ministry Report: The team met on Monday, March 11, 2019. The minutes of the Feb. 12 meeting were reviewed and accepted. Guests, Brandon Block and Kelly Anderson, from church ES FIRST spoke about their outreach mission to the homeless. Jon Deere reported on the balance for the Mission Trip fund; ideas were discussed for spring fund raisers. The team will meet again on April 9, 2019.

Safety Team Ministry: The team met on March 7, 2019 to discuss and plan for ongoing security issues for the church. Safety team training (A.L.I.C.E.) is scheduled following worship service on March 24, 2019; Lt. Paul White will provide the training. Bill Spencer will serve as chairperson for this team; Cheryl Faulkner will serve as recording secretary.

Hospitality Ministry Report: The team continues with the development of a "welcome greeter" team and creation of a Greeter and Ambassador manual. A new greeter desk has been placed in the Narthex.

Noah's Ark Preschool Report: The team met on March 14, 2019 and discussed safety concerns with plans to coordinate with the Safety Team concerning security cameras and monitors. A fundraiser for "This Little Light of Mine" scholarship is underway and slated for March 31, 2019 following worship service. The funds from the spaghetti dinner and silent auction will go to the scholarship fund for parents needing financial assistance for preschool children.

Children's CE team: The February and March meeting was held on Feb. 27. The main focus was setting short term goals for the next 3 months. Ideas included involving youth in church services, a "mentorship" for youth with adults in the church and a possible "backpack" blessing. Their next meeting is scheduled for April 3, 2019 at 5:30pm.

Worship Ministry Team: The team met March 5, 2019, with discussion of important upcoming dates of Ash Wednesday, Joint Session/Ministry team meeting, Palm Sunday, Easter Sunday and the Quasiquicentennial celebration slated for May 5, 2019. Diane Greenwood has accepted chairperson responsibility for this team. Linda McCollum will serve as secretary/computer guru.

A motion was made by Jerry Summers, seconded by Grace Harriger to accept the consent agenda: passed.

Financial – Carol Nolting

Church Mutual insurance review was completed, as scheduled by Carol Nolting. Jim Vassmer and Jerry Summers provided a summary of the meeting and the suggested changes made by Church Mutual for our coverage. At this time there will be no changes to insurance coverage.

Financials were presented line by line by Carol Nolting; year to date we are in a positive position. Bill Spencer made the motion to accept the financials as presented, seconded by Laura Mayfield; passed.

The representative from Edward Jones, Jeremy Stone, was to present financial investment information and he did not come to the Session meeting as scheduled. Carol Nolting will follow up to determine why and will reschedule this presentation.

Unfinished Business

Real Estate – Land to south of church has been listed for sale. Jerry Summers has accepted the position as "official signer" real estate transactions.

Committee Assignments – Pastor Dan provided a handout to each Elder assigning committee responsibility.

Finance Committee: Bill Spencer reported on changes that were made on depositing offerings and counting offerings. The changes provide a “check and balance” system for accuracy. The 5th Sunday loose change offering will be placed in the Brother’s Keeper account. Also, Carol Nolting is creating a form for use with any purchases that are not already budgeted; this will provide a more accurate record keeping for financials/budget. A motion was made by Jerry Summers and seconded by Laura Mayfield to accept the changes/report as presented.

Joint Session and Ministry team meeting: A meeting will be held March 28th, 2019 for exchange of information and reports that will encourage efforts to reach both short and long term goals, as they support our long term vision.

A.L.I.C.E. safety training is scheduled for Sunday, March 24, 2019; all are encouraged to attend this informational meeting concerning safety and security measures for Barbee.

Camera Security System: Bill Spencer reported for the group that checked the system at Crescent Lake Church on March 17, 2019. The safety team will continue ongoing work to secure a camera/monitor system for Barbee.

New Business:

MediaCom contract has expired and the charge for service has increased substantially, as reported by Pastor Dan and Carol Nolting. Some discussion resulted in questions for a 1 year contract versus the 3 or 5 year contract submitted to us from MediaCom. Pastor Dan agreed to follow up to obtain answers. He stated he will email the information to Elders when available.

Gas Leak: Bill Spencer reported that the church does have a gas leak that requires repair. Two different plumbers have been contacted for bids to repair, requiring him to leave voice mail messages, but they have not returned calls. Jeff Henson will continue to pursue this issue and Bill will email Elders with potential cost and will need immediate response from Elders when they receive his email of information.

Bill Spencer reported that Church Mutual preformed a Risk Assessment on the church building. There were two small items noted that Building and Grounds will address. The third to have the Federal Pacific electrical panels certified or replaced by a licensed electrician will be dealt with at a later date. In our annual review with Church Mutual we were advised that since none of the items were highlighted in red that at this time none of the items were have to do improvements, we just have to respond with a planned response. Pastor Dan reported that an underwriter will review our policy in November 2019.

Facility Use Request: Jerry Summers has requested use of the church on April 27th, 2019. An Eagle Court of Honor Ceremony will be held for his son, Drew. A motion was made by Grace Harriger and seconded by Bill Spencer to approve the use of the church; passed. Jerry will complete the require forms.

Grace Harriger made the motion to adjourn at 7:30 pm, seconded by Bill Spencer. Motion passed.

Sharon Senger closed the meeting in prayer.

The next scheduled meeting is April 15, 2019 at 6:30, adult classroom at the church.
