



## Pastor's Note:

---

If you are like me, Thanksgiving was an appropriate time to think about all the ways that God has so generously blessed us. Scripture tells us, "Every good and perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of the heavenly lights, who does not change like shifting shadows" (James 1:17). In other words, everything good comes from God. There is not one thing we have in this life, no relationship, no material possession, no ministry opportunity or job, that does not come to us by direct means of God's goodness. Jesus Himself knew this when He fed a crowd of 5,000 people (Matt. 14:13-21; Mark 6:30-44; Luke 9:10-17; John 6:1-15).

In many ways, Jesus feeding the 5,000 is the perfect Thanksgiving miracle. Despite all the pressure from the hungry crowds, Jesus doesn't crack. Before doing the job He came to do, He stops everything that He is doing and prays. Though being fully God, one with the Father in heaven, Jesus models for us what a posture of true gratitude looks like. When we see Jesus taking time to pray and express gratitude, we know that we have also been called to go and do likewise. We should stop and take time to thank God for the good things that he has given us. If Jesus thought it was worth doing, we certainly should too. Think about this for a moment. How different would your life look if it were lived with gratitude?

As much as we want to live lives of gratitude, sometimes it can be hard to cultivate in ourselves. Here are a few practical steps if you desire to grow in gratitude and thankfulness. First, slow down. Sometimes we live at too fast a pace. Try slowing down, spending time in God's word, and reflecting on all that He's done for you. Just making space to stop and reflect can make a big difference in our hearts. Secondly, stop the comparisons. Sometimes we look around and see people who appear to be so much better off than we are. God is the good provider. And just as He cares for the lilies of the field, He will care for you and your neighbor. This doesn't mean we get to have everything we want in life (certainly not) but changing our posture towards God's goodness in our lives will begin us on the path towards a changed heart. Thirdly, if you want to be a grateful person, be generous with what you already have.

I have found it helpful to focus less on what other people are doing for you, giving you, or helping you with, and instead, focusing my energy on the ways I can be the hands and feet of Jesus in their lives. I have slowly come to realize that at the end of the day, nothing we have now really belongs to us anyways. We are called to be stewards of what God has given us.

As you prayerfully consider your 2019 tithe that supports the ministries of our church, consider practicing an attitude of gratitude by remaining in the freedom to live radically generous, self-sacrificing lives. Like Jesus.

## Recipe of the Month: Easy Cobbler (Anne Mayes)

---

Preheat oven at 375 degrees

Melt ½ cup butter in a 9x13 cake pan

Mix together:

1 cup flour

1 cup sugar

3 tsp. baking powder

1 cup milk

Dash of salt

Directions: Pour batter over melted butter. Add a large can of sliced peaches, drained (or pie-filling of choice) on top of batter. Sprinkle with sugar and cinnamon. Bake @ 375 degrees for 45 minutes. Top with vanilla ice cream, if desired.

### MINUTES OF THE STATED MEETING OF THE SESSION OF BARBEE MEMORIAL PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH November 19, 2018

The Session of Barbee Memorial held its Stated Meeting on November 19, 2018 at 6:30 p.m. in the Adult Classroom of the church. Elders present: Laura Mayfield, Clark Pugh, Bill Spencer, Linda Chapman, Jim Vassmer, and Beth Humphreys. Excused: Jerry Summers. A quorum was established. Also present: Dan Clark, Pastor and Carol Nolting, Treasurer. Clerk of Session Cheryl Faulkner was absent due to health issues. Elder Beth Humphreys served as Clerk of Session pro tem for the meeting.

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m. and opened with prayer by Pastor Dan Clark.



The Agenda was reviewed. An item was added under New Business: a written request from Margo Taylor for Barbee to financially assist the wildfire victims in California. Motion to accept the changes to the Agenda was made by Laura Mayfield and seconded by Linda Chapman. Motion passed.

Minutes of Regular Session meeting October 22, 2018 approved by email vote on October 26. The minutes were signed by the Moderator and Clerk of Session.

**Ministry Team reports summarized:**

Worship Ministry team met November 6, 2018, reviewing the Chera Dinna outcome and continued planning for the Veteran's Day salute and flagpole dedication. There will be no meeting in December.

Hospitality team met on November 5<sup>th</sup> and continued planning for a "Welcome Center", welcome bags and church signage.

Vision Ministry team report: Presented Vision for 2023 to the congregation on November 18, 2018.

Children's CE Ministry meeting minutes: Planning continued for ongoing lesson topics as appropriate for age groups. High School youth are planning on a Mission Trip to Eureka Springs in June of 2019.

Noah's Ark Preschool team met on November 8, 2018. Plans for the Grandparent Feast, to be held November 19 and 20<sup>th</sup>, are a major focus at present. Lane of Lights fundraiser is slated for November 24<sup>th</sup>. The Christmas program is to be held December 15<sup>th</sup> at 2 pm. There will be no December meeting.

Mission Ministry minutes: Plans underway for Fall and Spring fund raisers. Bpb Gerdes will follow up with the Methodist church concerning prices of diapers for the December Good Samaritan collection. Next meeting will be January 8, 2019.

A motion to accept the consent agenda was made, seconded and passed.

**Financial: Carol Nolting**

Carol Nolting explained the Financial Report for October, highlighting some of the line items that were over or under budget. Carol stated that the Safety Team will be listed as a line item under the category "Building and Grounds" in the 2019 budget. We had a net deficit for the month of October due to our investments, but have an \$11,520.15 surplus for the year. Carol stressed that each of the teams/committees at Barbee need to have their 2019 budgets to Carol **no later than November 29<sup>th</sup>**. Carol urged every team/committee to be specific with their budget items. Barbee's 2019 budget will be presented to the Session at the December 17<sup>th</sup> Session Meeting. The 2019 Budget will then be presented to the congregation at the Called Congregational Meeting on January 27<sup>th</sup>, 2019. Bill Spencer made the motion to accept the Financial Report. Laura Mayfield seconded. Motion passed.

**Unfinished Business:**

Land appraisal information Pastor Dan reported that we are awaiting the survey results from M & M. The Session cannot move forward until we receive this information.

**New Business:**

Remote Deposit Machine:

Carol Nolting presented to the Session the many advantages of Barbee having a Remote Deposit Machine, among them: checks may be deposited as they are received, and deposits may be made in to multiple accounts. There is no cost for the scanner as long as Barbee is a client of Bank Midwest. Carol proposed placing the Remote Deposit programs on 2 computers: Carol Nolting and Carol Spencer. Bill Spencer made the motion to get a Remote Deposit Machine. Linda Chapman seconded. Motion carried.

Card Reader:

Carol Nolting presented information regarding a Card Reader, which would process both credit and debit cards. After discussion, Session had a few questions which Carol is going to address with the Representative. The matter was tabled until Carol is able to get further information.

Request for California wildfire assistance: Margo Taylor

A letter was read from Margo Taylor, requesting that Barbee collect a Love Offering for the people in California who have lost everything due to the wildfires. The Session had some logistical questions which Margo will need to address. Session would also like the money to be designated for a specific EPC Presbyterian in the affected area. When Margo has more information, she would be allowed to present a Minute for Mission to the congregation.

**Pulpit Opportunities:**

Pastor Dan will be away December 30<sup>th</sup> and January 6<sup>th</sup>. Will need someone to fill in.

**Communion in January:**

Pastor Dan will be gone January 6<sup>th</sup>. Bill Spencer made the motion to move Communion to January 13<sup>th</sup>. Linda Chapman seconded. Motion carried.

**Angel Army: Lani O'Dell**

Pastor Dan reported distributing the 300+ "Christmas in July" toys to Lani O'Dell, leader of the "Angel Army." Lani was most appreciative of the toys.

**Operation Christmas Child:**

Laura Mayfield reported that 50 shoe boxes were filled and ready to ship to children in parts of the world who might not have Christmas without this ministry. She also received monetary gifts to help pay for the shipping costs.

**Presbytery Meeting report:**

The Session thanked Bill and Carol Spencer for attending the recent Presbytery meeting in Hannibal, Missouri. The meeting was held in a church that was built in 1834.

**Facility Use Request: none**

The next scheduled meeting is December 17, 2018

Bill Spencer made the motion to adjourn. Clark Pugh seconded. Motion passed.

Pastor Dan closed the meeting in prayer. 8:30 p.m.
