Pastor's Note:

Have you ever met anyone who loves hearing how good they are? Have you ever heard someone nonchalantly remind others of all that they have done, just to make sure others know? Have you ever encountered a person who loves the praise of others almost like God loves for His people to praise Him? I have. Some people do things to receive the praise of men and women and not of God. Jesus says, **"Be careful not to do your 'acts of righteousness' (good deeds) before men, to be seen by them. If you do, you will have no reward from your Father in heaven."** Matthew 6:1

Our Lord, reminds us, that if we do things to receive the praise of men and women, we will most certainly receive a reward. But that reward will be temporary and not very satisfying in the long run. The praise of men and women is often very fickle, fleeting and superficial. Jesus says we should rather prefer to please God, the One whose reward really matters! Unfortunately, many people in this world seek not to please God but other people.

Flattering words are spoken, lies to cover up displeasing things, and boasting of one's successes, are all rampant in this world. Sadly, even many brothers and sisters in Christ seek the rewards of men. Admittedly it is tempting at times to seek the praises of men, especially when you may seem so often to be left out and unseen by others. However, Jesus says there is no gain in the praises of people, even in the praises of our brothers and sisters in Christ. The One we should seek a reward from is God Himself! However, there is a potential dilemma.

If we do good works only to receive praise in the first place, from men or even from God, then our good works are now tainted with selfishness and they no longer are good works! We must remember that even in secret, we should not say to ourselves, "I'm going to do this so that God can bless me or tell me how great I am!" Instead, what we do should be done out of our love for God and our love for others in, with and by the love of God! We should help others, not to receive human praise, but rather, to share the love God has for us, and in turn, give God the glory.

When we are doing good works, it is not for the praise of men and women, but for the glory of God who gives us the ability to do such things. We are to keep the eyes of our hearts on Jesus and offer words of praise to our Father, saying, "Lord, this is for You. Not for them, not for me, just for You!" The Apostle Paul writes, **'Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for men, since you know that you will receive an inheritance from the Lord as a reward. It is the Lord Christ you are serving.'** Colossians 3:23-24

The next time you are in the midst of an 'act of righteousness' (a good deed), and you desire praise, look up and give God the glory. Don't seek the praise from men and women. Do all things, as to the Lord, and not for people. Do all things, to glorify God, not to bring yourself higher. May we never forget that it is God who sees and knows all that we do, and it is God, who we should seek to please, not men and women who give praise based on fleeting emotions. God stands firm and unchanging, and so are His promised blessings and rewards. Praise God!

Graduates Information Needed:

We will be recognizing the 2019 Graduates on Sunday, May 12th. We need the name of your graduate, the school they are graduating from, and their plans for future schooling or trade. Please give the information to Carol Spencer no later than Wednesday, May 8th.

Recipe: PINA COLADA CAKE from Beth Humphreys

1 yellow cake mix (I prefer Duncan Hines)	1 large box vanilla instant pudding
1 can Eagle Brand condensed milk	1 20 oz. can crushed pineapple, well drained
1 can Cream of Coconut (find it near the condensed milk, coconut oil, etc. at the store)	8 oz. container Cool Whip
	1 cup flaked, sweetened coconut

Bake the yellow cake in a 9 X 13 metal pan, according to package directions. Take the cake out of the oven when it tests done in the center. While still hot, use a fork to poke many holes in the cake. Thoroughly mix the can of condensed milk and the can of cream of coconut, and pour slowly over the cake. Refrigerate the cake until cool. Prepare the vanilla instant pudding according to directions, then stir in the can of well drained crushed pineapple. Spread the pudding mixture over the top of the cake and refrigerate once again. When the pudding layer has set, carefully spread one container of Cool Whip over the top of the cake. Top the Cool Whip with the flaked coconut. Keep refrigerated.

MINUTES OF STATED MEETING OF SESSION OF BARBEE MEMORIAL PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH April 15, 2019

The Session of Barbee Memorial held its Stated Meeting on April 15, 2019 at 6:30 p.m. in the Adult Classroom of the church. Elders present: Laura Mayfield, Clark Pugh, Bill Spencer, Jim Vassmer, Jerry Summers, Sharon Senger and Grace Harriger. A quorum was established. Also present: Dan Clark, Pastor and Moderator and Clerk of Session, Cheryl Faulkner. Carol Nolting, treasurer, was unable to attend due to work obligations.

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 pm. and was opened with prayer by Pastor Dan Clark.

The Agenda was reviewed with the addition of items under unfinished business: remote deposit for Noah's Ark preschool. Under new business: insurance quotes from Brotherhood Mutual. Grace Harriger made the motion to accept the agenda with additions, Jerry Summers seconded the motion: the motion passed.

Consent Agenda Items:

Clerk's report – attendance was reported for small groups and church services.

Minutes of Regular Session meeting March 18, 2019 were approved by email vote by March 29, 2019.

Minutes of Special Session meeting April 14, 2019; approved April 15, 2019, Session meeting

Ministry team reports as summarized:

Finance ministry team: will meet next month

Mission Ministry Report: A spring fund raiser is planned for May 6 -12 at Charlie's Car Wash in Liberty. The group continues to work with ES First for a "2nd mile Ministry and City Love food" ministry. It was decided to help fund school lunches for those unable to pay for their school lunches at Lewis and Westview Elementary schools. Their short term vision is: "Grow in our understanding of the needs of our community and respond to those needs". The team will meet again on May 14.

Safety Team Ministry: Ministry team leader and scribe attended presentation hosted by Church Mutual on April 8, 2019. Short term one year vision and goals are currently being created.

Hospitality Ministry Report: Greeter & ambassador materials are ready. The team is looking forward to sign ups soon. Work continues on updates to printed materials.

Noah's Ark Preschool Report: The team met on April 12, 2019 and items covered included the successful fund raiser for This Little Light of Mind scholarship fund raising over \$3000. Plans are underway for graduation of Pre-K on May 11, 2019.

Children's CE team: The team met April 4, 2019 to discuss their short term vision/goals, lesson topics, ideas to have youth and church members mingle, plus plans for summer classes.

Worship Ministry Team: The team met April 2, 2019 and first items covered were Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday services. Much of the planning focused on the May 5 Quasquicentennial (125 Years) celebration. Other plans for future events were Mother's Day and Graduation service.

Youth Ministry Team: The team will be meeting in May; no meeting or report this month.

Deacons: No meeting this month

A motion was made by Jerry Summers and seconded by Bill Spencer to accept the consent agenda: passed.

Financial – Pastor Dan Clark in the absence of Carol Nolting

Pastor Dan Clark presented the financials line by line; he specifically brought attention to the unbudgeted items of gas leak repair and water heater that have been replaced/repared. The remote deposit monthly charge was discussed in relation to the preschool sharing in the cost of this service. Bill Spencer made the motion to charge a flat rate of \$20 per month to the preschool budget, seconded by Jerry Summers: passed. Electrical quotes are expected for the replacement of electrical fuse boxes which is another unbudgeted item. Jerry Summers made the motion to accept the budget as presented, seconded by Laura Mayfield; passed

Edward Jones update: The representative was to present information on investments last month, but did not arrive at the Session meeting. Carol Nolting contacted the agent and his response was "my bad" – a letter will be written to the corporate office concerning our disappointment and the lack of professionalism displayed by our agent.

Unfinished Business

MediaCom contract: Pastor Dan followed up on the costs for 1 year, 3 year and 5 year contracts. He conveyed this information to Session Elders per email. The choice was a 3 year contract with the provider and was approved by email vote.

Presbytery meeting will be April 30 in Columbia, MO; Bill Spencer and Pastor Dan Clark plan to attend.

Joint Session and Ministry team meeting: A second meeting will be held April 30, 2019 at 6:30 pm for exchange of information, short term vision and goals for each ministry team.

Real Estate for sale signs have been placed on the property.

Electrician quotes: as mentioned under financials, quotes are expected from several commercial electricians to determine the cost of replacing our old electrical boxes. Our insurance provider, Church Mutual, noted the condition of the current system and the need to address and update it.

Pulpit opportunities: May 12 and May 19 are still open for Elders to fill the pulpit. The June 23rd date will be filled by the Youth of the Church under the leadership of Laura Mayfield. She requests assistance with offering count on that date; no one volunteered but will check schedules and cover her that day.

New Business

Brotherhood Mutual Insurance: The finance team will be comparing quotes from Brotherhood Mutual Insurance to Church Mutual, our current insurance company. The finance team will report their findings and recommendations to Session.

Reminder: Honor Court will be held on April 27 for Drew Summers – all are encouraged to attend this service. Jerry presented the request to take the current flag as a memento of Drew's efforts to erect the flag pole and flag. Jerry will buy a replacement flag for the church; all Session members were in favor of this request. All agreed no motion was needed.

Pastor Dan Clark will be attending General Assembly in June; the Session meeting for June was discussed. Bill Spencer made the motion, seconded by Laura Mayfield, to not have a June meeting unless something urgent should arise. Passed

Facility Use Request: none

Laura Mayfield made the motion to adjourn at 7:00 pm, seconded by Jim Vassmer. Motion passed.

Laura Mayfield closed the meeting in prayer.

The next scheduled meeting is May 20, 2019 at 6:30, in the adult classroom at the church.

STEPHEN MINISTRY:

The long-range hope for Stephen Ministry was focused on offering a vital lay ministry providing one-to-one care for individuals facing life challenges - simply, bringing Christ's love and care to people in a time of need. More specifically training individuals to offer their time and listening skills to support and encourage those going through divorce, loss of a loved one, chronic illness or cancer.

Our efforts produced a core group of dedicated individuals who completed 50 hours of training and were willing to serve and support for two years. We had five people who completed their training and three that served as Stephen Ministers. Our 3 Stephen Ministers made themselves available to 8 different care receivers over the course of their two

years. And while Stephen Ministry is based on confidentiality, I can tell you that they made every effort to meet with, listen to and encourage those folks they were asked to support through this ministry. Our Stephen Ministers are exceptional.

Colossians 1:9b-10 says: *"We continually ask God to fill you with the knowledge of his will through all the wisdom and understanding that the Spirit gives, so that you may live a life worthy of the Lord and please him in every way: bearing fruit in every good work, growing in the knowledge of God..."*

That being said, it has been three years since Cheryl Faulkner and Judy Clark first went to Texas to train to be Stephen Leaders. And in spite of every effort made by ourselves and our Stephen Ministers our Stephen Ministry is at a stand still. We are bearing no fruit. Therefore, we are suspending this ministry.

It saddens us greatly to be at a point where we feel that the Spirit is answering our prayers regarding this ministry and saying *"Not now."* Perhaps there is a different approach or format for this type of ministry at Barbee in the future. We truly hope so. We know that there are other ways members of a congregation can support one another. It will be our prayer that our church members will take our Vision Statement seriously and truly *"grow in spiritual maturity to spread the Good News into the brokenness of the world."*


